Through the years numerous residents who initially did not require financial assistance developed a need for charitable support. We have stood by these residents when they have been at the most vulnerable times in their later lives: financially, physically, and emotionally.

The Episcopal Home Communities is proud to say that not one resident in its 84-year history has ever been required to leave due to inability to pay. Mrs. A. always seems to have a smile on her face, and a warm word for everyone. She is blessed with a zeal for life, providing cheer to residents and staff alike. Now in her 90's, she dresses fashionably every day, enjoys recounting the colorful places she has visited and lived, and still entertains friends daily. A Scripps Kensington resident for more than ten years, she has enjoyed countless walks in the gardens. "I came to The Kensington because the Episcopal Church has been strong in my life," she says. "I think I've been involved with nearly every committee here at one time or another." Mrs. A. is an erudite, retired career woman and a widow, whose resources now are limited, but who is able to remain in her home because of the charitable care program to which Scripps Kensington is committed.

Father K. had many incarnations. Born in Ireland he survived the Nazi Blitz of Dublin that killed his parents. Father K. went on to serve in the British navy, then into banking, finally into his lifelong vocation of service as an Episcopal priest. From a leper colony in Africa, to singing at Queen Elizabeth's coronation, to serving as parish priest in communities throughout the U.S. and Canada, Father K. selflessly devoted himself to ministering to the pastoral needs of thousands of people from all walks of life. Retired at the age of 72, he came to The Kensington because it was affordable. Having lived most of his life on a modest salary, he gave much of it away to the needy. Father K., too, loved the gardens, the time to stroll and meditate, and catching up on reading all of Tom Clancy's novels. After five years as a resident, he passed away. Scripps Kensington's charitable resources enabled Father K. to enjoy a well deserved and rewarding retirement.
